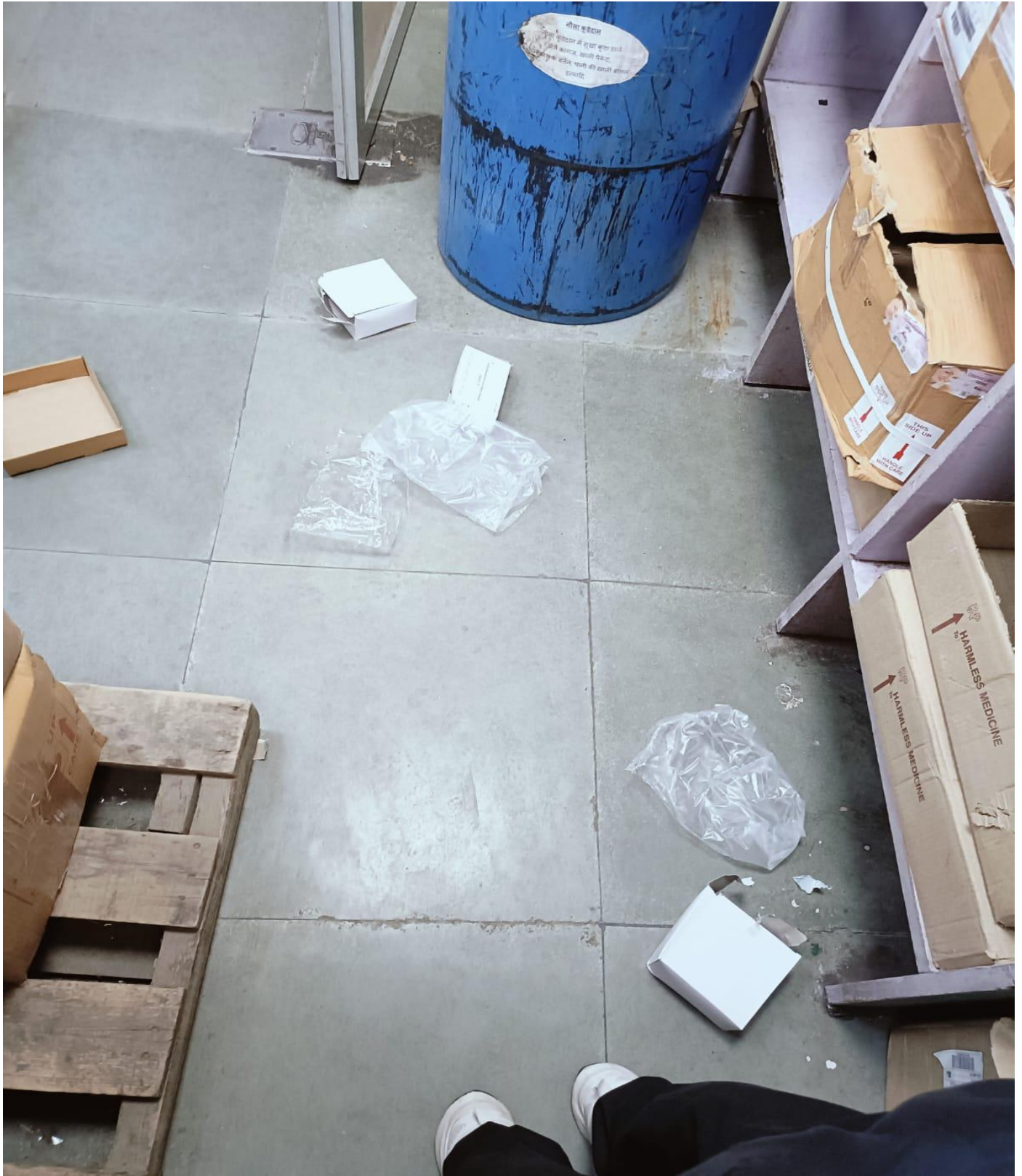
These activities not only support Swachhata Abhiyan's goal of hygiene and safety but also strengthen hospital quality standards and patient care.
